- Walk down to Rocky Point Pier to meet boat (MV Oceanwatch, operated by Indian Arm Recreational Services)
- Safety Talk & Ground Rules
- Travel by boat to Cates Park for Tsleil-Waututh Nation Traditional Welcome (Cease Wyss, Dennis Thomas)
- Snack Time
- Explore Burrard Inlet with TWN guide, visiting some of the Nation's archaeological sites; storytelling and drum songs
- Travel to Barnet Marine Park
- Break for lunch*
- Explore beach
- Return to Rocky Point Park
- Group activities

DAY 2

- Meet at Rocky Point Park washrooms for check-in and facility use
- Explore Shoreline Trail as a nature walk, discovering local flora, fauna and intertidal species; learning activities
- Snack Time
- Return to outdoor 'classroom' for activities (Rocky Point Park picnic shelter)
- Break for lunch*
- Touch-Tank and watershed model activities
- Group games based on the day's learnings
